These plans are uploaded to the college's Learning Management System (e-Shikshak), facilitating easy monitoring of syllabus progression by the Principal and promoting alignment with academic standards.

Sonarpur Mahavidyalaya, in collaboration with the University of Calcutta, meticulously upholds the examination and evaluation regulations set forth by the university. At the commencement of each academic session, a meticulously crafted academic calendar is developed, aligning seamlessly with the schedule outlined by the affiliating university. This calendar encompasses essential dates such as admission deadlines, class commencements, internal examinations, and final assessments.

Departments within the college meticulously follow tailored teaching plans, assigning tasks and assessments to students in accordance with the specific requirements of their curriculum. Internal examinations are conducted in strict adherence to the academic calendar and syllabus structure.

Within the framework of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), internal assessment constitutes 35% of the total marks, with 10% designated for attendance, 10% for internal assessment, and 15% for tutorial projects. In practical-based subjects, both internal and external evaluations contribute equally, each accounting for 50% of the total marks. Furthermore, for practical-based subjects, in addition to attendance (10%) and internal assessment (10%), 30% of the marks are allocated for practical examinations.

To support various administrative and academic functions, including college admissions and website maintenance, the institution invests in Tally Software and Annual Maintenance Contracts (AMCs) for essential anti-virus software in computers, library automation software, and servers.

Regular renewals of contracts for water coolers, aqua guards, and broadband internet connectivity with Wi-Fi facilities are managed by the Office and the bursar. Decentralized administrative committees effectively distribute responsibilities among faculty members, including those in the library department and non-teaching staff, ensuring the smooth operation of these systems.

Additionally, staff members oversee the cleanliness and upkeep of furniture, while laboratory assistants are tasked with maintaining functional equipment. Through these well-established systems and procedures, within our limited resources, Sonarpur Mahavidyalaya ensures the effective management and optimal utilization of its facilities for the benefit of its stakeholders.

This calendar encompasses essential dates such as admission deadlines, class commencements, internal examinations, and final assessments.

Departments within the college meticulously follow tailored teaching plans, assigning tasks and assessments to students in accordance with the specific requirements of their curriculum. Internal examinations are conducted in strict adherence to the academic calendar and syllabus structure.

Within the framework of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), internal assessment constitutes 35% of the total marks, with 10% designated for attendance, 10% for internal assessment, and 15% for tutorial projects. In practical-based subjects, both internal and external evaluations contribute equally, each accounting for 50% of the total marks. Furthermore, for practical-based subjects, in addition to attendance (10%) and internal assessment (10%), 30% of the marks are allocated for practical examinations.

2. **Indirect Evaluation Method:** Feedback is collected from students upon completion of the course. Feedback forms, each carrying a maximum of 24 marks, are distributed among students to gather their responses. An average score is computed based on the feedback provided by the students.

The attainment level score for each course is determined by combining 80% of the direct evaluation method score with 20% of the indirect evaluation method score. The attainment levels are categorized as follows:

- **Low Attainment Level:** Below 50%
- **Moderate Attainment Level:** 50%-75%
- **High Attainment Level:** Above 75%

The college boasts 14 Undergraduate Departments, each offering UG courses, with dedicated WiFi-enabled cubicles ensuring connectivity across campus. Through meticulous administration, classrooms are efficiently allocated for all classes, equipped with proper seating arrangements for students and faculty. With a total of 32 fully-functional classrooms, the institution ensures a conducive environment for academic activities.
